## COMMUNICATION A Witch's Shopping List

**Learning Objectives:** To practise asking for things, practise telephone language.

**Preparation Time:** 5–10 minutes

**Completion Time:** 35 minutes

**Skill/Grammar:** Speaking / *Have you got any ...?*

**Age/Level:** Teenagers–Adults/Pre-Intermediate

*How much/many ...? I'm afraid we've run out*

*of \_\_\_\_\_. We're getting some more next week.*

**Resources:** The board, handouts 1 and 2, a transparency with a telephone dialogue. Make 1 copy of the worksheet for each pair of students. Write/type the telephone conversation, on a transparency of interactive board.

### Warm-Up (10 minutes)

- Write on the board “Abracadabra!” who says that? Why?
- Ask students if they believe in witchcraft. Why? Why not?
- Ask students if they know where witches can find the right supplies to cast their spells.
- What kind of spells do the witches usually cast? (love spells, banishing spells, hate spells, etc.)
- What ingredients do they usually use in their spells?

### Presentation (10 minutes)

Set the scene: A witch needs some supplies; she has made a list and is going to call a witchstore to order them.

Have the students ordered anything over the phone? What was it? Elicit some useful telephone expressions.

Show a transparency of the telephone dialogue (see below), in jumbled order on an OHP or IWB.

Ask students to work with a partner to put the sentences in order.

### Practice (15 minutes)

Pair up students:

- Explain that student A is a witch who wants to order some supplies over the phone and student B works for a witchcraft store. They should sit back to back.
- Allow a minute or two for reading and checking vocabulary.
- Students role play the conversation.

Walk around and help if necessary.

B: Yes, please / No, I'll pick the stuff up myself.


A: OK then. Thank you for your order. Have a nice day/evening.
